

PROGRAM NOTES

Then we first began producing our annual theatre festival in 1999, we called it the Festival of New American Theatre. The idea was that we'd do at least one new script by a Georgia playwright every year, with the other offerings being recent plays from around the country that had not yet been produced in the Atlanta area.

In 2001 we held our first Essential Theatre Playwriting Award competition, with the prize going to eighteen-year-old Lauren Gunderson for her play Parts They Call Deep, which shortly thereafter went on to be produced Off Broadway in the Young Playwrights Festival. Lauren's career has continued to thrive and she is now the most produced living American playwright. Other Essential playwrights have gone on to success around the country and, since 2012, our Festival has focused exclusively on the work of Georgia writers. This year we'll be presenting four staged readings of new Georgia plays in our Bare Essentials series, along with a workshop



reading of Anterior Leverett's Yanni Stone and the Honeypot Trap by Hush Harbor Lab. And beloved Atlanta actress Carolyn Cook will give two performances of a piece she's created and written called Walk With Me.

But, as always, the main focus of the Essential Festival will be the two fully staged World Premieres we'll be presenting. Over the years, it's often been the case that, once we've chosen the plays we'll be producing, we become aware of connecting themes or threads between them that we hadn't always recognized when we were making our selections. This year, both of the plays center around families that are haunted by the loss of one of their own, someone

who died in questionable circumstances. They also look at the question of who does and does not belong in those families, a theme going back to the ancient Greeks, with their tragedies about children that have been abandoned or banished and parents who refuse to accept or even recognize them.

Who are we to each other? What love and loyalty, acceptance and forgiveness do we owe one another? These are age-old themes which are still all too relevant to our world today.

Beverly Austin's The Wishing Place is a poetic memory play set in the rural Georgia of the 1960s, while Matthew Hoffman's The Manuscript takes place in the more recent times of 2015, when matters of who could and could not be legally married had finally been decided by the courts (though it was not yet settled in the minds and hearts of all the people). Both of these plays look deeply into the souls of their characters and hold up a mirror to ourselves. They continue the proud Essential Theatre tradition of bringing new work by Georgia writers to the world stage.



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



Carolyn Cook has spent the last twelve years learning about dementia as she and her siblings navigated their mother's dementia care. She participated in the 2015 Memory Bridge Training Retreat, a five-day intensive program leading to positive, meaningful dementia relationships. Carolyn co-developed and performed Blackberry Winter, a play by Steve Yockey about a woman whose mother has Alzheimer's disease, co-produced by Out of Hand Theater and Actor's Express, and has chronicled her experiences with dementia care in her blog, Lifelong Metamorphoses. An Atlanta theater veteran, Carolyn has worked with Seven Stages, Horizon Theatre, Actor's Express, Theatrical Outfit, the Alliance Theatre, Georgia Shakespeare, and Theater Emory, and is the founder and artistic director of Atlantabased Théâtre du Rêve (Theater of the Dream), a professional theater company that brings French language and Francophone culture to life on the American stage. She is honored to team with Ann McSweeney, CEU Creations, and Essential Theatre to bring you this production of Walk With Me.





Anne McSweeney is a licensed clinical social worker and owner of CEU Creations – a company providing educational trainings for helping professionals. She has a diverse background in medical social work, education, and community relations. With a social work career that spans over two decades, Anne has been planning educational trainings for over 17 years. One of her biggest passions is incorporating the arts into education – using music, plays, films and other forms of multi-media to better engage learners and immerse them in unique, educational experiences.

STAFF

PETER HARDY (Founding Artistic Director, The Manuscript Director) is an award-winning playwright and director who has been working professionally in the Atlanta area since 1986. He has directed more than 100 productions and has won multiple screenwriting awards from film festivals around the world, as well as several playwriitng awards. For the summers from 1990 to 2005 he served as Artistic Director of the outdoor drama Unto These Hills in North Carolina. There have been around 30 productions of his plays done around the country, and Mysterious Connections was chosen for the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center's National Playwrights Conference. Last year his play *The Other* Part of the Picture was chosen for the Lanford Wilson New American Play Festival. Now in its 25th year, this is the only contest exclusively dedicated to the work of Georgia playwrights. The winning play will receive both a full production and a \$750 cash prize.


